

- 2. Link for online admission to various courses (except Integrated Programme): http://buniv.edu.in
- 3. For applying to more than one course, candidates have to apply separately.
- 4. All necessary documents to be uploaded must be adequately scanned in PDF format.
- 5. All the files uploaded must be visible and reproducible.
- 6. Size of the file/document (max. 200 kb per document).
- 7. The dates mentioned above are subject to change depending on the circumstance.
- 8. The provisionally admitted candidates must furnish the mark sheets/ Grade Cards of the final examination as and when asked. Otherwise, the admission will be canceled.
- 9. The Migration Certificate must be produced whenever the University asks for.
- 10. The original documents will be verified at the time of counseling for admission.
- 11. Anti-ragging:
 - a) Applicants have to submit duly filled Anti-Ragging Forms as and when they are asked by the University.

ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

Bodoland University is a State University established under the Bodoland University Act, 2009 of the Assam Legislative Assembly on 28th February 2009. It is one of the fast-growing universities in lower Assam and the lone institution of higher education in the western part of Assam to address the needs and concerns for overall development of the region. Bodoland University is committed to the academic development of lower Assam in general and especially the BTAD region. The University provides an opportunity for higher studies to the populace of this region. It also caters the educational needs of the adjoining states and neighboring countries like Bhutan, Nepal, and Bangladesh.

Bodoland University is an affiliating University. It has 17 PG Departments, 53 Affiliated Degree Colleges, 4 DIETs, and 3 B.Ed. Colleges and a Law College. The University offers PG and 5 Year Integrated Programme with Academic Curriculum following the Choice-Based Credit System of UGC. Along with core subjects, Bodoland University also provides Diploma in Bamboo Technology, Post-Graduate Diploma in Human Rights & Education (PGDHRE), and several other Short-Term Diploma and Certificate Courses. Padma Shri Madaram Brahma Central Library, a digitally well-equipped library of the University provides knowledge and wisdom with multifaceted facilities. The University also has Health Centre, Technology Incubation Centre, Intellectual Property Right Cell, Bus service, and Hostel facilities for students and research scholars.

The picturesque campus of the University is located at Rangalikhata, Debargaon which is 8 km north of Kokrajhar town. The location of the University helps students and researchers across the border to get access to the University conveniently. Bodoland University is well-connected by a land road network including National Highway 31, Railway (Kokrajhar Railway Station), and Airways at Rupsi Airport (70 km). The international boundary of Bangladesh (110 km) and Bhutan (40 km) and the state boundary of West Bengal (45 km) are accessible by roadways. The University has two additional facilities at Haldibari (3 km from the main Campus) and Subaijhar (1.5 km from the main Campus).

III. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

1. ELIGIBILITY FOR M.A. / M.Sc. / M.Com./IP/Certificate courses:

- a) For Integrated Programme (IP) HS (10+2) with 45% marks or equivalent grades.
- b) For PG programmes, B.A. / B.Sc. / B.Com. (10+2+3 pattern) with Major / Honours course in the concerned subject with 50% marks.
- c) Anyone who has attained HS (10+2) or any other higher degree from any recognized institution shall be eligible for the certificate courses.

d) **Relaxation of Marks:** Candidates for the reserved quota (SC / ST) shall be given relaxation up to 5% of the marks. The relaxation will not apply to candidates seeking admission in any other reserved quota.

2. ELIGIBILITY FOR M.C.A. IN COMPUTER SCIENCE & INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

- a) B.Sc. (10+2+3 pattern) with Major / Honours course in the concerned subject.
- b) B.C.A / B.Sc. (IT) (10+2+3 pattern) with Mathematical Science in 10+2 level.
- c) B.Sc. (in the 10+2+3 pattern) with Computer Science / Information Technology as a pass course / elective subject.
- d) B.Sc. (10+2+3 pattern) with General Pass course with one-year Computer Diploma (Post-Graduate) from recognized institute and Mathematical Sciences in (10+2) level.
- e) B.E. / B.Tech. (CSE or IT)

3. ELIGIBILITY FOR M.Sc. BIOTECHNOLOGY

- a. Science Graduate having Honours in any of the Biological Sciences with 50% marks or equivalent Grade.
- b. Pass course students with a minimum of 50% marks or equivalent grade having at least one biological subject in their course combination.
- c. Relaxation of Marks: Candidates for the reserved quota (SC/ST) shall be given relaxation up to 5% of the marks. The relaxation will not apply to candidates seeking admission in any other reserved quota.

4. ELIGIBILITY FOR DBT (DIPLOMA IN BAMBOO TECHNOLOGY):

H.S. passed (any stream).

5. ELIGIBILITY FOR M.B.A.

- a. A Bachelor Degree of 10+2+3 pattern with a minimum of 50% marks or equivalent grade in aggregate or Major/Honours subject (if any) from any recognized University.
- b) Relaxation of Marks: Candidates for reserved quota (SC/ST) shall be given relaxation up to 5% of the marks. The relaxation will not apply to candidates seeking admission in any other reserved quota.

6. ELIGIBILITY FOR M.C.A.

- a. A Bachelor's degree of minimum 3 years duration in any discipline with at least 50% marks in major /Honours subject or 55% marks in aggregate for those candidates having no major/honours.
- b. Relaxation of Marks: Candidates for the reserved quota (SC/ST) shall be given relaxation up to 5% of the marks. The relaxation will not apply to candidates seeking admission in any other reserved quota.
- c. Candidates must have passed in Mathematics as a subject at 10+2 level or graduation level.

7. ELIGIBILITY FOR PGDHRE

- a. Graduate in any discipline with 45% marks or equivalent grade.
- b. Relaxation of Marks: Candidates for the reserved quota (SC/ST) shall be given relaxation up to 5% of the marks. The relaxation will not apply to candidates seeking admission in any other reserved quota.

8. ELIGIBILITY FOR B.Ed.

- a. Graduate or equivalent from any recognized university with at least 50% mark in aggregate.
- b. In case of an applicant who failed to secure 50% in the UG course, then the candidate must have secured 55% in the PG course.
- c. Relaxation of Marks: Candidates for the reserved quota (SC / ST) shall be given relaxation up to 5% of the marks. The relaxation will not apply to candidates seeking admission in any other reserved quota.
- d. Teachers deputed by the Govt. of Assam for the course must submit a study leave certificate / No Objection Certificate from their concerned employers along with the application.

9. ELIGIBILITY FOR M.Ed.

- a. B.Ed. / B.T. of Bodoland University or any other university recognized by this university with at least 55% marks in aggregate as per latest NCTE norms.
- b. Relaxation of Marks: Candidates for the reserved quota (SC / ST) shall be given relaxation up to 5% of the marks. The relaxation will not apply to candidates seeking admission in any other reserved quota.
- c. Teachers deputed by the Govt. of Assam for the course must submit a study leave certificate / No Objection Certificate from their concerned employers along with the application.

10. CERTIFICATE COURSE IN BODO

- a. Graduate in any discipline with 45% marks or equivalent grade.
- b. Relaxation of Marks: Candidates for the reserved quota (SC/ST) shall be given relaxation up to 5% of the marks. The relaxation will not apply to candidates seeking admission in any other reserved quota.

11. ELIGIBILITY FOR Ph.D.

As per UGC guidelines.

IV. RESERVATION QUOTA

(a) 80% of the total seats will be reserved for the merit students of affiliated colleges of Bodoland University. The remaining 20% is open for all merit students from UGC-recognised universities, including Bodoland University. (Not applicable for B.Ed and M.Ed programmes).

(b) Reservation of seats for the students belonging to different categories will be as per the Government Rules.

Note:

- 1) 20% out of the total seats are reserved for CUET (Common University Entrance Test) qualified candidates. However, the vacant reserved seats for CUET will be adjusted by the BU entrance qualified candidates.
- 2) BU Employee's son, daughter, and spouse: 02 (two) seats in each department (in addition to intake capacity).
- 3) Fringe village (within a radius of two kilometers): 05 (five) seats for the University (within intake capacity; maximum two seats per department).
- 4) Candidates seeking admission in the category of OBC & MOBC must submit a non-creamy layer certificate of the current year.
- 5) *EWS 10% reservations will be calculated out of total unreserved seats.
- 6) 25% seats over and above the total intake capacity are reserved for international students. The reserved seats for international students will not be adjusted by national students at any circumstance.

V. ADMISSION BASED ON SPORTS / EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

For admission against the quota allotted for extra-curricular activities like Cultural, Sports, NCC, Scouts & Guides, the candidates must furnish the requisite documents. A few seats (not more than two) may be offered by the concerned Department for admission to M.A. / M.Sc. /M.B.A. / M.C.A / M.Com. / M.Ed. / B.Ed. courses to students within intake capacity who have shown extraordinary proficiency in extracurricular activities in the last three years preceding graduation. Any sport/event organized by an association must be recognized by and affiliated with the national body for that sport/event and by Indian Olympic Association.

Preference will be given to candidates in the following order:

- (a) Those who have represented the country in international events;
- (b) Those who have represented their states in National/International events;
- (c) Those who have represented their institutions in International/National events;
- (d) Those who have won prizes at recognized International/National level events;
- (e) Those who have won prizes at recognized State level competitions;
- (f) Those who have represented the University in N.S.S. Camp at the National level; and
- (g) Those who have obtained NCC 'C' Certificates or participated in the Republic Day Parade at the National level under NCC.

VI. COURSE DURATION

(a) Integrated Programmes : 5 years (10 Semesters)

VII. HOW TO APPLY

- 1. The candidate must carefully go through the online prospectus and be acquainted with all the requirements before filling out the online Application Form.
- 2. A candidate can apply in different departments separately.
- 3. Scanned copy (PDF format) of the original certificates/documents should be uploaded:
 - i) Degree mark sheets (as indicated in the online Application Form)
 - (a) For applying to Master /Diploma Courses candidates must clear all semester examinations or appearing in the ensuing 6th/8th Semester Examination in UG course without any arrear/ betterment/ back paper.
 - (b) Candidates who have cleared the 4th / 6th Semester Examination in Three / Four-year UG courses (B.A., B.Sc., B.Com., B.E., B.Tech., etc) must upload all the mark sheets up to the 4th/ 6th semesters.

- (c) Candidates who have passed UG Final Semester Examination, including B.Ed. / B.T. need to upload only the Final semester mark sheet.
- (d) Applicants with more than one mark sheet/ grade sheet in a particular semester (repeaters/ betterment) must upload all the mark-sheets / grade-sheets in a single PDF file.
- ii) Relevant documents (e.g., 10th standard pass certificate / admit card / birth certificate) for age verification.
- iii) Relevant certificate(s) from the concerned authority when applying for admission under any category of reservation.
- iv) 10th and 12th standard mark sheets and pass certificates.
- v) In the case of B.Ed. and M.Ed. Programme applicants deputed by Govt. of Assam must submit a study leave certificate / No Objection Certificate from their concerned employers.
- vi) The applicants who have passed the qualifying examination earlier than the current year will have to submit a gap certificate from any of the following:
 - a) The Head of the Institution last attended.
 - b) Officer-in-charge of the nearest Police Station.
 - c) Govt. Gazetted Officer is testifying his/her activities during the interim period.
 - d) Medical Certificate from the Govt. Medical Officer on the genuine medical ground(s).

VIII. SELECTION AND ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- a. For admission into Integrated Programmes, there will be no entrance test. Candidates will be selected as per the Assam Government Guidelines.
- b. For admission into B.Ed., M.Ed., and all PG Courses, Entrance Test will be conducted by Bodoland University. The entrance test will carry a total of 100 marks. The mark distribution will be 80 marks for MCQ-type questions and 20 marks for descriptive type of questions. However, for MBA, the written test will be only for 80 marks and 10 marks for group discussion, and 10 marks for personal interview.
- c. Selection will be purely based on merit basis.
- d. Admission into Ph.D. programme will take place as per the latest UGC Guidelines 2024. (Ref.: No. F.4-1(UGC-NET Review Committee)/2024(NET/140648) Dated: 28-03-2024).
- e. The in-service candidates admitted for Ph.D. will have to submit a No Objection Certificate from the Head of the Institution at the time of application. The Departmental Research Committee (DRC) will decide the number of Ph.D. scholars as per the Bodoland University Ph.D. regulations.
- f. If a forged document submitted by a candidate is detected even after admission, the admission will stand canceled.
- g. The Admission Committee has every right to refuse admission if the candidate fails to produce the original documents when asked for.
- h. The decision of the Admission Committee regarding admission is final.

IX. CANCELLATION OF SEATS

A student failing to attend classes for fifteen days (15 days) at a stretch from the date of commencement of classes shall forfeit his / her seat.

X. ATTENDANCE

75% class attendance is compulsory to appear in all end semester examinations. An undertaking must be submitted during the time of admission assuring to fulfill the required attendance.

XI. SUPREME COURT RULES REGARDING ANTI-RAGGING

1) As per the direction of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, the Government has banned ragging completely in any form inside and outside the campus. Accordingly, Bodoland University authority is determined not to allow any form of ragging inside the university premises. Whosoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets, or instigates ragging within or outside the University shall have an FIR lodged against him/her, and he/she will be suspended or rusticated from the institution and shall also be liable to be fined which may extend to Rs. 10,000/-. In case the applicant

for admission is found to have indulged in ragging in the past or if it is noticed later that he/she has indulged in ragging, admission can be refused or he/she shall be expelled from the institution. The punishment may also include suspension from attending classes, withholding/ withdrawing fellowship/ scholarship and other financial benefits, or withholding the result.

- 2) The candidate, as well as his / her parents, during the admission, will be required to furnish an undertaking in the form of an affidavit that the candidate will not indulge in any form of ragging.
- 3) Submission of Affidavits on Anti Ragging: All admitted students will have to submit two duly-filled Affidavits on Anti Ragging to the concerned Head of Department as and when asked for. Students admitted to hostels will have to submit a second set of the two Affidavits to the Warden of the concerned hostel as and when asked for.

The Concept of the Technology Incubation Centre was inaugurated in 2012 at Bodoland University, initially focusing on the cultivation of mushrooms as a demonstration of rural technology. Since then, the center has undertaken various goal-oriented extramural projects funded by agencies such as the Department of Agriculture (BTC), the Department of Tourism (BTC), DICC-Kokrajhar, DBT-GoI Technology Incubation Centre on Mushroom, the DBT-GoI KISAN Hub program, and the DBT-Biotech Hub program for entrepreneurship and skill development of the youth in this region.

With the alarming growth of the global population, the proportional increase in food and nutrition has become a prime concern. This issue is exacerbated by the depletion of fertile agricultural land and other resources. Another issue gaining importance in various discussions is solid waste management, including agricultural waste. Thus, the Technology Incubation Centre of Bodoland University, utilizing rural technology and the concept of a circular economy, has successfully provided employment opportunities to youth and alternative livelihoods to rural farmers by focusing on waste management as the epicenter.

The Centre holds ISO, FSSAI, and Udyam certifications. Covering an area of 10,500 square feet, it provides a platform for students, rural entrepreneurs, women entrepreneurs, and freelancers. The Centre offers summer and winter internship programs for incubates and has trained 10,542 farmers, as well as several entrepreneurs, self-help groups (SHGs), and NGOs.

Vision: To develop and enhance rural technologies for skill and entrepreneurship development, thereby augmenting self-aided employment and entrepreneurship ecosystems in the region, and also to provide low-cost yet high-quality health food with enhanced Vitamin D and other essential nutrients by utilizing low-cost agro waste.

Mission: Capacity building and economic upliftment of frontline farmers through an integrated zero waste management approach, involving interventions in cultivation, processing, and value addition of mushrooms.

The Centre proposes to offer a Certificate Course in Rural Technology (3 Months-Course Fee Rs. 2500/-) for rural entrepreneurs with informal education, a Diploma in Rural Technology & Bio-entrepreneurship (6 Months-Course Fee Rs. 4500) for rural youths with a minimum qualification of H.S Pass, and a PG-Diploma in Rural Technology, Bio-entrepreneurship & Skill Development (12 Months-Course Fee Rs. 5500) with a minimum qualification of a degree pass. The Course Content shall include Gobar Gas Preparation, Vermicomposting, Mushroom Cultivation (Basic Mushroom), Medicinal Mushroom, Value-added fortified food product production, Hydroponics, Aquaponics, Arecanut plate making Unit, Biofloc fish cultivation, Pearl Cultivation, Nursery Management, Beekeeping, Plant Tissue Culture, basic instrumentation, disease diagnostics, basic nutritional estimation, Spawn Production, Advanced Instrumentation (Optional), Business Development Models, etc.



1. LIBRARY INFRASTRUCTURE AND FACILITIES

The entire building is presently Wi-Fi connected, and users are also allowed to access the internet facilities through their laptops.
- **e) Surveillance system:** The various spaces in the premises of the library is under the CCTV surveillance.
- **f) Library furniture and equipment:** The PMBCL has adequate infrastructure to facilitate the users.

- g) Dspace Software: Dspace software has been installed for institutional repository.
- **h)** RFID system: The PMBCL is an RFID enabled and automated library integrated with open-source ILMS i.e., KOHA to provide computerized services to the users at large.
